

## **Charles McClain**

Charles McClain, who holds a Ph.D. from Stanford and a J.D. from Hastings College of the Law, is Vice Chair (Emeritus) of Boalt Hall's Jurisprudence and Social Policy Program and Lecturer in Residence. He has taught and pursued research for many years in the field of American legal and constitutional history. He is the author of, among other works, In Search of Equality: The Chinese Struggle for Civil Rights in Nineteenth-Century America and a four-volume anthology: Asian Americans and the Law: Historical and Contemporary Perspectives. He is presently collaborating with several other scholars on a history of the California Supreme Court. He received recognition for his writing from the historical society of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California and a Distinguished Research Mentoring Award from the Letters and Science College, U.C. Berkeley.

McClain has taught at Santa Clara law school, in the University of Nevada, Reno's Master of Judicial Studies program and at the Kenneth Wang School of Law, Suzhou University.

McClain is a member of the California bar. Before coming to Boalt in 1977 he was on the legal staff of the American Association of University Professors. He currently serves as a mediator for the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California. McClain has been on the board of the 1990 Institute since 1994.
