James T. Caldwell, bilingual in Chinese and English, has been a Director of the 1990 Institute since 1990 and active in the Children's Art and the Environment Program (CAEP) committee. He is also a Director of the US-China Green Energy Council, Chair of its Green Building Task Force and editor of the Conference Programs. As founder and president of E3 Regenesis Solutions, Inc., he specializes in building green energy alliances and energy systems integration for buildings and communities in the US and China. To facilitate multilingual publishing, Jim founded Pacific Rim Connections in the 1980's and was the first editor of the Unicode Standard (ISO10646) for multilingual computing. He later served as VP for Multilingual Computing at DAE Interactive Marketing (Ion Global, US).

Jim often travels to China and has worked in Beijing for several years. He has taught university courses on the Politics of Energy and the Environment, Chinese Politics, American Politics, Comparative Politics and World History at SUNY Binghamton and Iona College, NY. He was a post-doctoral fellow at the U.C. Berkeley Institute of East Asian Studies and later Assistant Director of the Center for East Asian Studies at Stanford University. He learned Chinese at Yale University, did graduate work at Columbia University and Harvard and earned his Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Austin. He is married to Jeannette Wei, another Institute director.
