

## Li-Chun Wu

Li-Chun Wu became a 1990 Institute board member after she translated several economic policy articles written by then President Hang-Sheng Cheng for then Chairman C. B. Sung. The translations were for the Chinese government to help them better understand Western economic policy. She is currently a director of US-China Green Energy Council, participates in organizing conferences, is assistant editor for conference brochures, and provides research information to the council. She has assisted her husband, Robert Wu in several other non-profit organizations' activities.

Before retirement, Li-Chun Wu worked as a contractor for San Jose State University Foundation and Sterling Software at NASA Ames Research Center, Life Science Division as their IT support person for twenty years. Before immigrating to the United States, she was a researcher for twenty years in Biology at Beijing Institute of Zoology, Chinese Academy of Sciences. During the 1960s she participated in the Academy of Sciences "Four Cleansing Movement " Task Force in Lu'an, Anhui Province, and at the May-Seventh cadre school in Qianjiang, Hubei Province, where intellectuals were being re-educated by peasant labor before the Cultural Revolution. She also acted as interpreter for foreign scientists visiting China, "borrowed" by the Bureau of Foreign Affairs, Chinese Academy of Sciences.

She attended The University of California at Berkeley, and graduated from Simmons College, Massachusetts, before returning to China in the late fifties.
